
Strong Cold Front – Jan 12th, 2024



OVERVIEW

A strong cold front will impact Eastern NC Friday Night, bringing the potential for several hazards.



| | TIMING | Conditions begin to deteriorate early Friday evening with gusty winds, with severe weather possible between 7 PM and 2 AM . |
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| | HAZARDS & IMPACTS | Strong Storms – Strong to locally severe thunderstorms with damaging winds and an isolated tornado are possible. Strong winds – Non-thunderstorm wind gusts up to 50 mph are possible (separate attached wind gust graphic), with the highest winds for coastal areas. A wind advisory is in effect here. Marine Impacts – Gale force wind gusts for coastal waters and sounds, large rivers. I0-I5 foot waves for coastal waters. Coastal Impacts – Minimal impacts, as the duration and marginal nature of southwesterly gales is quite brief. Water levels could reach as high as 1 foot above normal. |
| | FORECAST CHALLENGES | How much instability ("fuel" for thunderstorms) develops will help dictate the extent of the severe weather risk. Confidence is Medium on severe weather threat. |
